ABOUT THE ALLIANCE

In 2016, conservationists from across the state came together to form The Palmetto Land + Water Legacy Alliance. The purpose of the Alliance is to educate our state's residents about the SC Conservation Bank and the great work it does, and to enlist their support to make sure the SC General Assembly reauthorizes it in 2017.

The Conservation Bank was created 14 years ago to safeguard our drinking water, preserve our history and culture, and protect our precious natural resources. It's the only statewide source of public funding available for willing landowners and their land trust partners to voluntarily conserve important SC lands, and it will shut down if not reauthorized by June of 2018.

Mission statement

Our mission is to ignite a grassroots effort to ensure the protection of our farms, forests, natural areas and waterways, and the preservation of our cultural and historical sites, through the reauthorization South Carolina Conservation Bank in 2017.

Other major goals:

- Eliminate the sunset provision so the Bank can continue on a permanent basis (we acknowledge that the new bill is asking for 10 more years, but our goal is eventually making the Bank a permanent part of State government)
- Modify the "death clause" of the current law, so that the Bank will still receive at least minimal funding during lean budget years, instead of cutting it to zero
- Advocate that the statutory funding formula be allowed to function without modification or interference
- Expand the list of organizations, individuals, companies and agencies that support the mission of the Alliance
